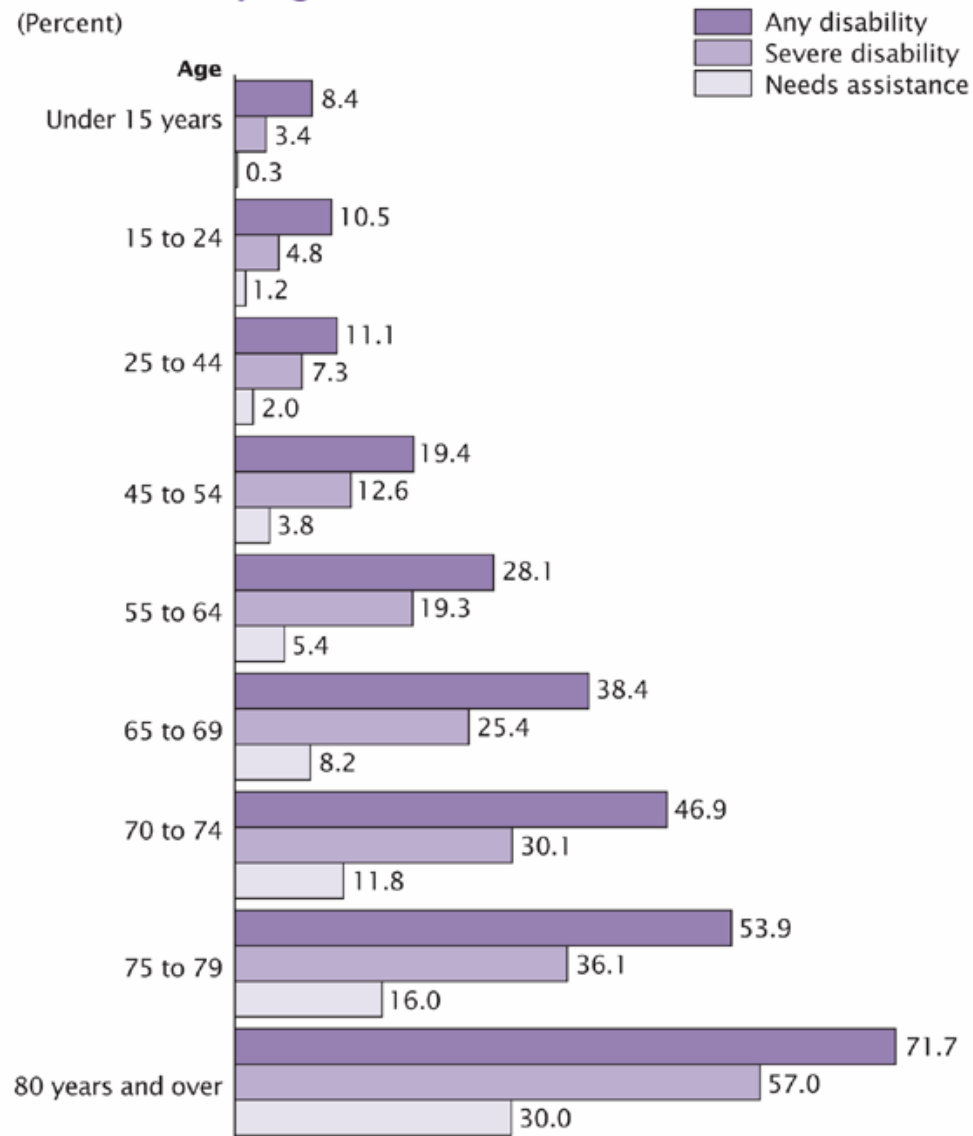

(Percent)

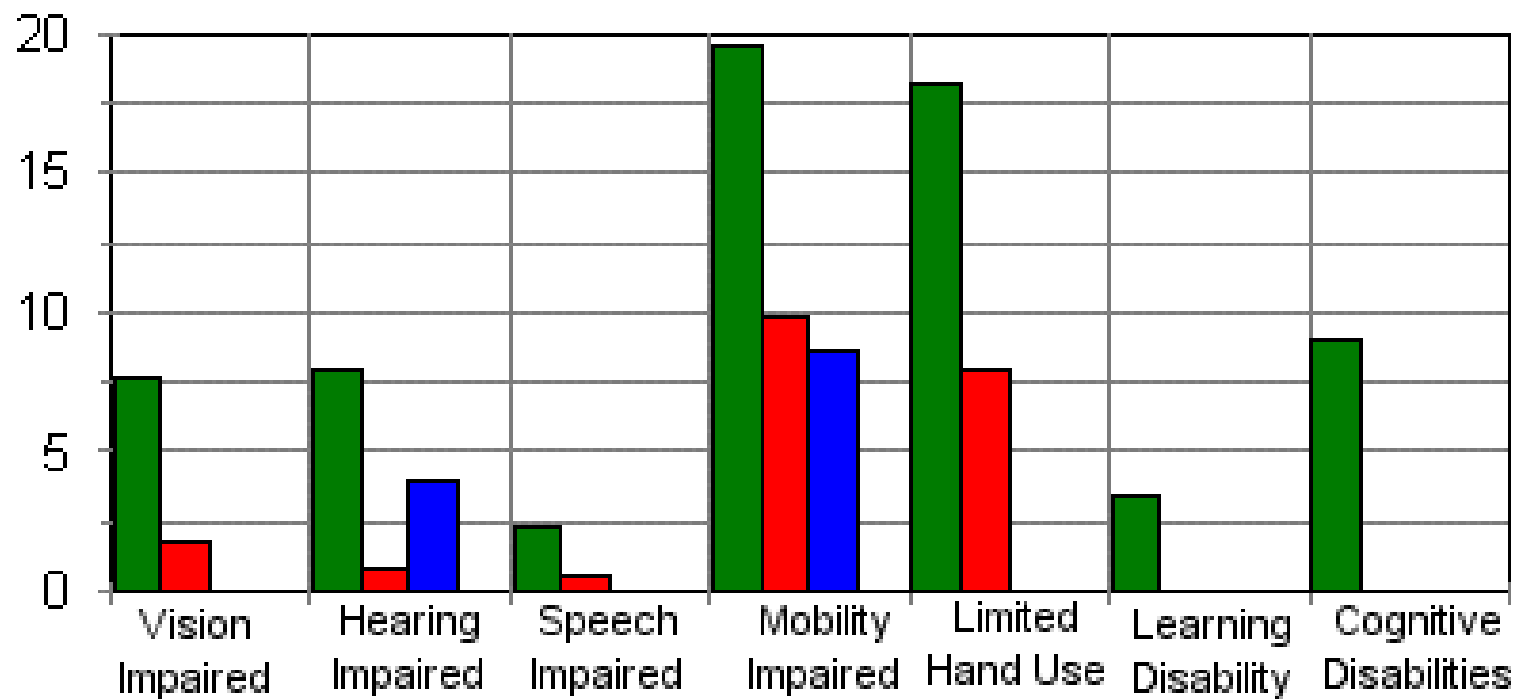

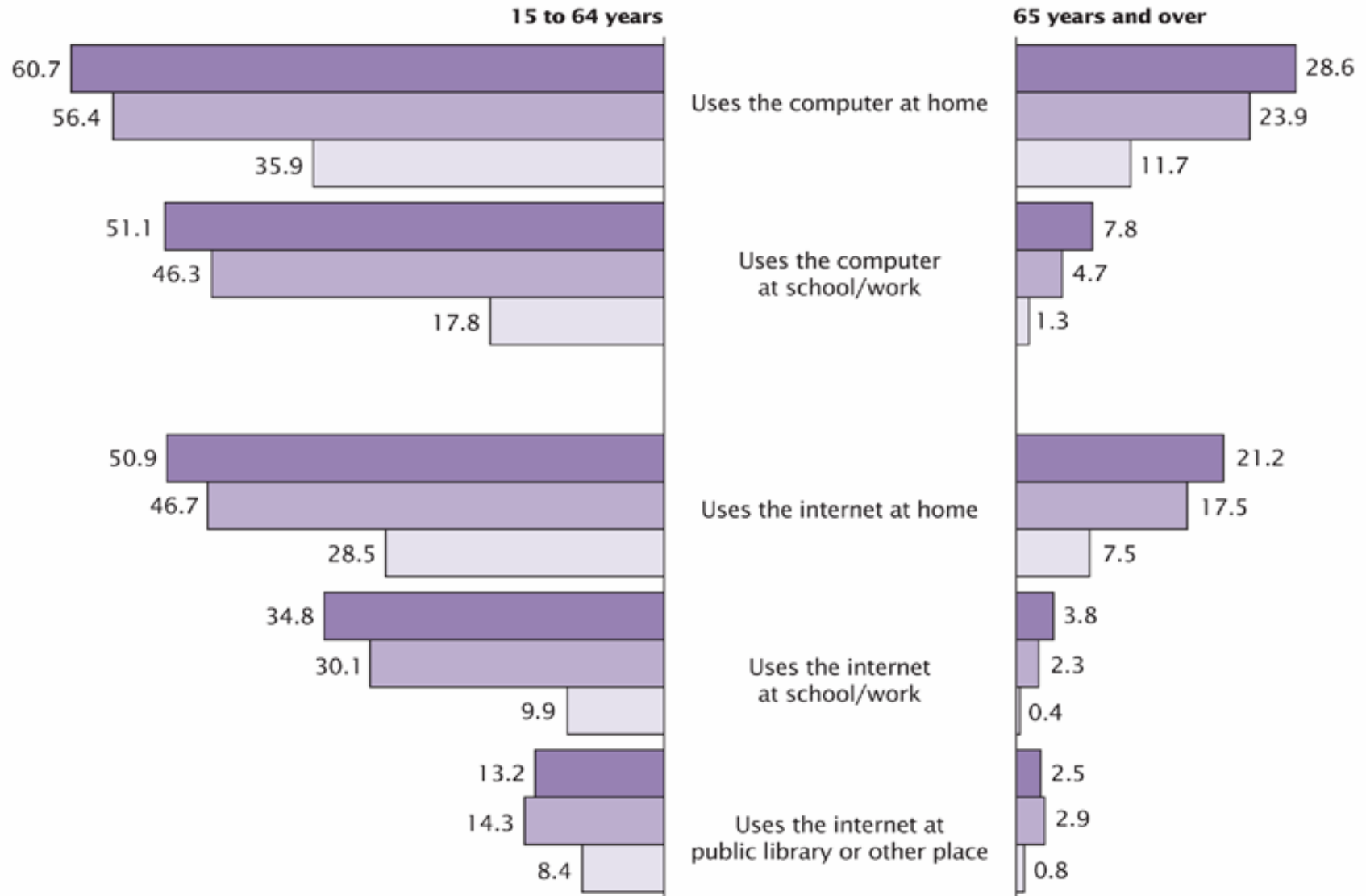
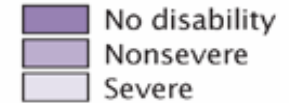

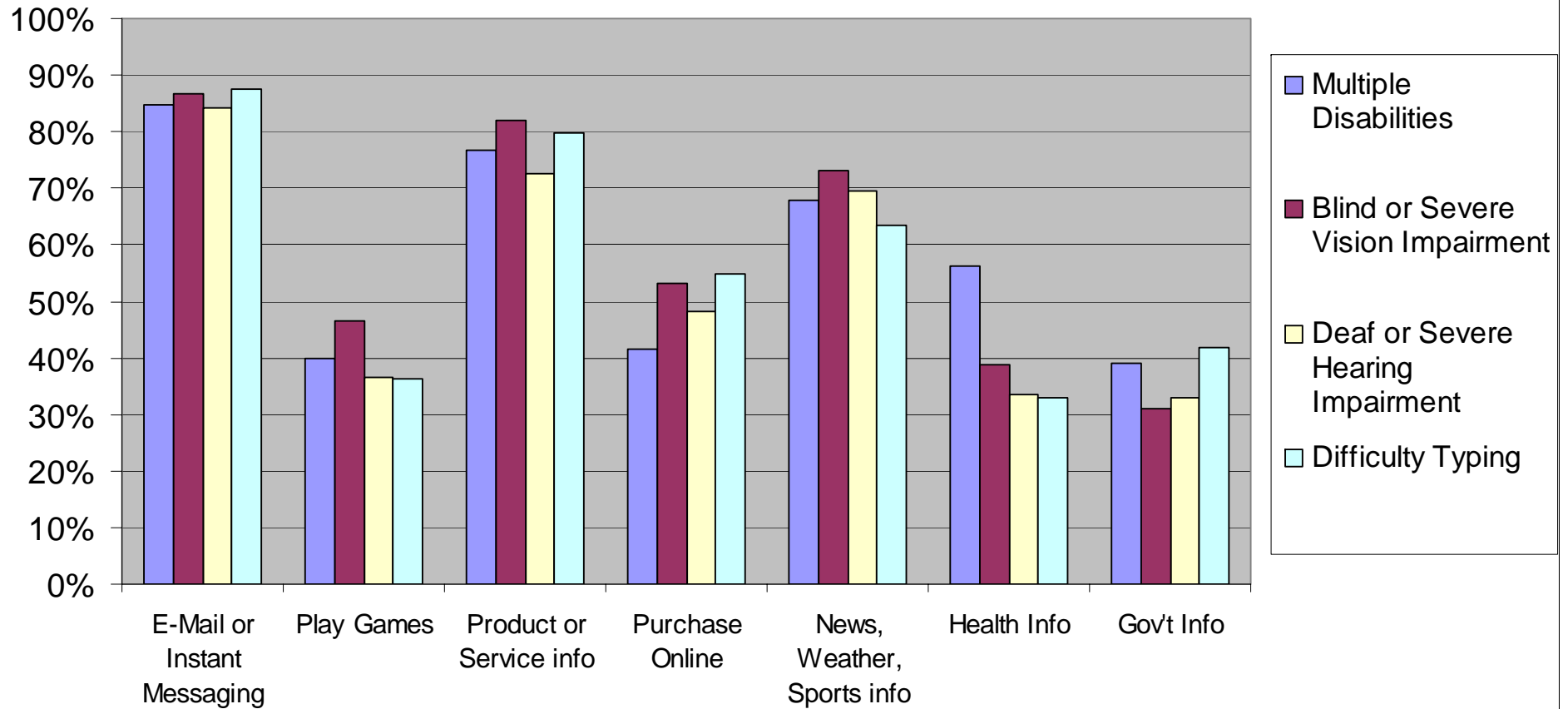
Computer and Internet Usage by Age and Disability Status: 2002
