

## **Overview**

National Public Automated Documents Online (NPADO) is a document assembly project that hosts interactive forms for the nonprofit legal aid and access to justice community, and assembles professional-looking legal documents based on a user's input. The NPADO system increases opportunities for self-represented litigants to achieve justice on their own and improves efficiency for legal aid and pro bono programs and courts.

## **Participating Groups**

Local legal aid organizations use HotDocs Professional, two copies of which have been donated by LexisNexis to each state community, to create automated documents and upload them to the NPADO system. When the document is uploaded to NPADO, it can then be linked to from a state's public or advocate statewide website. The NPADO system is also compatible with interview templates created using the A2J Authoring System.

## **Recent and Upcoming Improvements**

NPADO is operated by Pro Bono Net, in collaboration with Kaivo Software, Capstone Practice Systems and Ohio State Legal Services Association. Pro Bono Net assumed a leadership role in mid-2006, in order to provide the project with national leadership and support. A key portion of this support is developing a long-term sustainability plan, which will be completed in the spring of 2007.

The NPADO initiative continues to receive funding from the Legal Services Corporation. The project received a 2007 TIG grant, co-funded by the State Justice Institute, that will fund two staff positions: a Circuit Rider who will work closely with courts and legal aid programs to build document assembly partnerships, and a Project Coordinator who will manage project activities, including developer training and support and technology enhancements and maintenance. In addition, the California Administrative Office of the Courts has contracted with Pro Bono Net to improve the reliability and usability of the NPADO system.
